Med-Ready Healthcare Awareness Foundation Announces Get One, Give One! Celebrity Golf Tournament

The first annual Get One, Give One!TM Celebrity Golf Tournament takes place on Friday, August 21, at Morgan Creek Golf & Country Club in Roseville, California. This huge event is being held to raise donations for the Med-Ready Healthcare Awareness Foundation, whose goal it is to provide free healthcare screenings and wellness checks to our local children in need. The foundation's Get One, Give One!TM program is being launched at a time when an estimated one million children in California are going without health insurance," says Ray Guanill, the foundation's president. "Many children in our own state don't see a doctor unless it's an emergency. The parents may not be able to afford health insurance, and the kids suffer as a result."

The Med-Ready Healthcare Awareness Foundation wants to raise at least \$50,000 at the golf tournament for their Get One, Give One!TM program to help these children get the health care they need. Every dollar raised will go towards a free wellness check, immunization, or healthcare screening for the child to diagnose their health and needs.

Celebrities who will appear at the golf tournament are Adrian Ross, former player for the Cincinnati Bengals, and Harold Pressley, former player for the Sacramento Kings. Other celebrities will be announced closer to the tournament date.

Post-game festivities include a dinner, silent auction, live music, and after party. Sponsorship opportunities are now available, and donations for the silent auction are being accepted and appreciated.

Entry fee is \$150 per player, or \$600 per foursome, which includes green fees, use of a golf cart, a continental breakfast, contest entry, and access to the silent auction, dinner, and after party. Those who want to attend only the dinner and after party pay \$45 each. A continental breakfast and tournament check in will begin at 8:30 a.m. Shotgun start is at 9:30 a.m.

All proceeds of the golf tournament will benefit the Get One, Give One!TM program. "This is a great way for everyone to give back to the community and help our kids. Every child deserves proper medical care. There's nothing more important than our children's health," says Guanill.
